<u>MOTHERING SUNDAY</u> – Today is Mid-Lent Sunday also known in the Anglican Communion as Mothering Sunday. Other names for today are "Laetore" meaning "Rejoice" from the opening Latin words of the Mass; and "Refreshment Sunday." Today is a day to take a break from the rigors of Lent. In the Anglican Communion it was the day to return home to visit your Mother and to attend your home Parish. The traditional food of the day is "<u>Simnel Cake</u>". Printed below are prayers and sentences for the day that you may find meaningful in your devotions.

<u>Sentence</u> - "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you, and you shall be comforted in Jerusalem," says the Lord. (Isaiah 66:13)

<u>Collect</u> - Everloving God, Your care for us is greater even than a mother's love for her child; teach us to value a mother's love and see in it an expression of your grace, that we may ever feel more deeply your love for us in Christ Jesus our Savior.

Blessed are you, God of strength and patience; yours is a love our mothers showed us, yours in the care we need; as we learn to care for one another and to share it first of all

Readings - Psalms 84; Isaiah 49:13-16 - A Mother's Love; Ephesians 3:14-21-Christ lives in our hearts; Luke 2:40-52 -The Holy Family

<u>Post Communion Sentence</u> - Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother. (Galatians 4:26)
